Shipping and Storage

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit is shipped in 2 boxes. [Skull and cross bones]

- Box 1 is shipped on dry ice and must be stored at -30 to -15°C in a constanttemperature freezer upon arrival.
- Box 2 is shipped on cold packs. Open immediately and store the QIAseq Beads and QIAseq Ligation solution at the appropriate temperatures.
 - QIAseq Beads (Box 2) should be stored at 2–8°C.
 - \odot Ligation solution should be stored at –30 to –15°C.

When stored under these conditions and handled correctly, the product can be kept based on the expiration date on each component without reduction in performance.

QIAseq Index kits (ordered separately) are shipped on dry ice and should be stored at -30 to -15° C in a constant-temperature freezer upon arrival.

Introduction

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit enables, targeted next-generation sequencing (NGS) of the T cell receptor (TCR) immune repertoire. This highly optimized solution incorporates unique molecular indices (UMIs) to facilitate ultrasensitive and accurate characterization of the immune repertoire in cells and tissues. The required input for a single QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library ranges from 10 to 1000 ng of RNA.

The adaptive immune system is composed of T and B lymphocytes that bind antigens via highly specific TCRs and B cell receptors (BCRs) on their cell surfaces. To recognize a nearly infinite number of potential antigens, extensive sequence diversity of TCRs and BCRs is generated by somatic V(D)J recombination of the TCR and BCR loci, and by subsequent somatic hypermutation and class-switching recombination of the BCR upon antigen stimulation. Accurate characterization of the TCR and BCR repertoires is key to understanding adaptive immune responses and has many applications across different fields, including vaccine development, autoimmunity, monitoring treatment response in lymphoid malignancies, and immunotherapy.

Compared to traditional methods, NGS provides an unprecedented, high-resolution picture of the immune repertoire. However, many available immune repertoire sequencing methods involve multiplex PCR with primers targeting different V or J regions, which can introduce substantial amplification bias.

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit utilizes unique molecular indexing (UMIs) with targeted single primer extension (SPE) enrichment to robustly create targeted RNA-seq libraries for NGS instruments. This library construction approach greatly improves amplification uniformity compared to multiplexed PCR-based V and J primer pools. The incorporation of UMIs before the amplification step further reduces amplification bias and allows for accurate and sensitive TCR clonotype and repertoire diversity assessment.

Combined with a data analysis pipeline that has been developed to perform all necessary steps of NGS data processing including clonotype identification, the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit is a complete sample-to-insight solution for precise characterization of the TCR immune repertoire using NGS.

Principle and procedure




Figure 1. QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit workflow.

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit relies on a highly efficient, TCR-specific cDNA synthesis, TCR gene-specific single primer enrichment (SPE) and unique molecular indexing (UMI) for accurate and sensitive TCR clonotype and diversity assessment. TCR reverse transcriptase and enrichment panel primers are provided, together with all of the necessary library construction reagents. The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit is designed to enrich TCR α , β , γ and σ subunits using 10–1000 ng RNA (Figure 1, next page).

cDNA synthesis

RNA samples are first reverse transcribed into cDNA with TCR-specific RT primers. Subsequently, second-strand synthesis occurs, which generates double-stranded cDNA (ds-cDNA). This ds-cDNA is then end-repaired and A-tailed in a single-tube protocol.

UMI assignment

Prior to target enrichment and library amplification, each original cDNA molecule is assigned a UMI by ligating an adapter containing a 12-base fully random sequence (i.e., the UMI) to the ds-cDNA. Statistically, this process provides $4^{12} - 16,777,216$ possible indices per adapter, with each DNA molecule in the sample receiving a unique UMI sequence. In addition, this ligated adapter also contains the first sample index.

Target enrichment and final library construction

Following UMI assignment, target enrichment is performed to ensure that TCR cDNA molecules are sufficiently enriched in the sequenced library. For enrichment, ligated cDNA molecules are subjected to targeted PCR using one TCR constant-region-specific primer and one universal primer complementary to the adapter. A universal PCR is ultimately carried out to amplify the library and introduce platform-specific adapter sequences, as well as additional sample indices.

NGS adapter and index technologies

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kits can utilize either combinatorial dual-index adapters (CDI) or unique dual-index adapters (UDI) adapters. The UDI adapters significantly reduce the risk of index bleeding issues ("index hopping") associated with Illumina sequencing instruments that utilize patterned flow cells. With unique dual indexing (UDI), each sample will be assigned two unique sample indices to overcome the error introduced by image analysis, sequencing error, and demultiplexing, and to remove mis-assignment of sequencing data to the wrong samples.

Next-generation sequencing on Illumina NGS systems

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit is compatible with Illumina NGS systems (MiniSeq[®], MiSeq[®], NextSeq[®] 500, HiSeq[®] 2500, HiSeq 3000/4000, and NovaSeq[™] 6000). When using Illumina NGS systems, QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries require a custom sequencing primer for Read 1 (QIAseq A Read1 Primer I). It is recommended to allocate between 2–10 million reads per sample.

Data analysis

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire pipeline automatically performs all steps necessary to generate TCR diversity and clonotype report from your raw NGS data.

The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit Analysis pipeline is available through cloud, desktop, and server software packages. For cloud-based analysis, researchers can utilize the QIAseq section of GeneGlobe Analyze (https://geneglobe.qiagen.com/analyze) on www.qiagen.com. For desktop and server support, QIAGEN Genomics Workbench (https://digitalinsights.qiagen.com/products-overview/discovery-insights-portfolio/analysis-and-visualization/qiagen-clc-genomics-workbench/) can be utilized.

Important Notes

RNA quality

The most important prerequisite for RNA sequence analysis is consistent, high-quality RNA from every experimental sample. Therefore, sample handling and RNA isolation procedures are critical to the success of the experiment. Residual traces of proteins, salts or other contaminants may either degrade the RNA or decrease the efficiency of, if not block completely, the enzymatic activity necessary for optimal targeted enrichment. Sample purity can be checked with the QIAxpert[®]. Due to the large intronic region between the TCR J and constant regions, it is recommended that RNA should be free of DNA to avoid wasting sequencing reads on intron region.

The QIAGEN® kits listed in Table 1 are recommended for the preparation of RNA samples from cells, tissues, and serum/plasma samples. For best results, all RNA samples should be resuspended in RNase-free water.

Important: Do not use DEPC-treated water.

For best results, all RNA samples should also demonstrate consistent quality according to the following criteria:

RNA quantification

The concentration and purity should be determined by measuring the absorbance in a spectrophotometer such as a QIAxpert. As the spectral properties of nucleic acids are highly dependent on pH, we recommend preparing dilutions and measuring absorbance in 10 mM Tris·Cl, pH 7.5. The A_{260}/A_{280} ratio should be >1.8.

Ribosomal RNA band integrity




Figure 2. Ribosomal RNA integrity. A Agilent Bioanalyzer electropherogram of high-quality total RNA showing sharp peaks for the 18S (left) and 28S (right) ribosomal RNA. Due to high quality of the RNA, peaks do not have shoulders (especially to the left of each peak). B Agarose gel electrophoresis shows sharp bands (especially at the bottom of each band) for 28S and 18S ribosomal RNA.

Run an aliquot of each RNA sample on the Agilent Bioanalyzer using an RNA 6000 Nano LabChip[®]. Verify that there are sharp bands/peaks present for both the 18S and 28S ribosomal RNAs (Figure 2). Any smearing of the RNA bands or shoulders on the RNA peaks indicates that degradation has occurred in the RNA sample.

For best results, the ribosomal bands should appear as sharp peaks. Ideally, the RIN number for non-FFPE RNA from the Agilent 2100 Bioanalyzer should be higher than 8.

RNA input amount

QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit provides results with as little as 10 ng or as much as 1000 ng total RNA per cDNA synthesis reaction.

The optimal amount of starting material depends on the relative TCR immune repertoire diversity and the abundance of the TCR clonotype. Detection of lower-abundance clonotypes requires more RNA; high-abundance clonotypes require less RNA. Greater amounts of input total RNA will provide better sensitivity for specific clonotype detection when sufficient instrument read budget is allocated.

For successful results, we recommend that first-time users start with 200 ng total RNA. We recommend using a consistent amount of total RNA for all reactions in a single experiment.

Sequencing capacity and sample multiplex level

Sample multiplexing is one of the most important NGS tools for increasing throughput and reducing costs. It works by combining multiple samples to be processed together in a single sequencing run; as a consequence, sequencing reads need to be demultiplexed by reassigning each single read to its original source library. This is facilitated by the integration of index sequences into the individual adapter molecules.

QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kits include either a fully compatible CDI or UDI indexing solution. We recommend using the QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index sets. Each QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library index kit includes one of the following:

- QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set A (384) (cat. no. 333725): UDIN-96AA paired with UDIS-96AK
- QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set B (384) (cat. no. 333735): UDIN-96BA paired with UDIS-96BK
- QIAseq 96-Index I Set A (384) (cat. no. 333727): IL-701NJ paired with IL-502SK
- QIAseq 96-Index I Set B (384) (cat. no. 333737): IL-716NJ paired with IL-502SK

CDI adapters use twelve i7 and eight i5 barcode motives that can be combined to form up to 96 combinatory dual indices. In contrast, QIAseq UDI kits use a fixed combination of 2 unique barcode motives per adapter molecule. Therefore, each single-index motive is only used once on any UDI adapter plate.

Usage of UDI adapters effectively mitigates the risk of read misassignment due to index hopping. This is enabled by filtering misassigned reads during the demultiplexing of individual samples, thus generating highly accurate output data.

To multiplex more than 96 libraries in a single sequencing run, combine indexing kits with different QIAseq 96-Index I (CDIs) or QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index (UDIs) sets. For example, combining the combinatorial QIAseq 96-Index I Set A (or B, or C, or D) (96) kits will allow the generation of 384 libraries with different combinatorial sample indexes for 384-plex sequencing. Likewise, up to 192 samples can be run when using both the unique dual QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set A and Set B (96) kits.

Sample multiplexing capacity is defined by the immune repertoire diversity and sequencing platform read capacity. General guidelines are provided for the number of samples that can be multiplexed in different sequencing platforms, based on 500–1000 ng PBMC RNA (Table 2). Fine-tuning the read depth and read budget will be possible after the first test run. Adjustments should be made for different sample type, input, and specific application, as necessary.

Next-generation sequencing read-length recommendations

When using Illumina NGS systems, QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries require a custom sequencing primer for Read 1 (QIAseq A Read1 Primer I). The QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries can be sequenced two ways depending on whether or not the complete variable region or mainly the CDR3 region require sequencing.

Complete variable region

QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA CDI libraries require 251 bp paired-end reads and dual 8 bp indices, while QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA UDI libraries require 249 bp paired-end reads and dual 10 bp indices.

CDR3 Region only

QlAseq Immune Repertoire RNA CDI libraries require asymmetrical 261 bp for Read 1 and 41 bp for Read 2 paired-end reads and dual 8 bp indices, while QlAseq Immune Repertoire RNA UDI libraries require 259 bp for Read 1 and 39 bp for Read 2 paired-end reads and dual 10 bp indices.

Protocol: QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit for Illumina Instruments

Important points before starting

- This protocol covers all procedures required for the preparation of libraries for Illumina sequencers from "standard RNA" (i.e., cells or tissues).
- Before setting up the reaction, it is critical to accurately determine the amount of the input RNA (10–1000 ng). We recommend using 200 ng total RNA. Lower input amounts are possible; however, this will lead to fewer sequenced UMIs and reduced detection of low-abundance clonotypes.
- Set up reactions on ice.
- Do not vortex any reagents or reactions.

Protocol: RT primer hybridization

Procedure: RT primer hybridization

- 1. Pre-heat a thermal cycler to 65°C with a heated lid (set at 103°C).
- 2. Thaw the RNA samples on ice. Gently mix, briefly centrifuge to collect residual liquid from the sides of the tubes, and then return to ice.
- 3. Prepare the reagents required for RT primer hybridization.
 - 3a. Thaw TCR RT primer if required at room temperature.
 - 3b. Mix by flicking the tube, and centrifuge briefly.
- 4. On ice, prepare the RT primer hybridization reactions as described in Table 3. Briefly centrifuge, mix by pipetting up and down 7 to 8 times (do not vortex), and briefly centrifuge again.

- Transfer the tube from ice to the pre-heated thermal cycler, and incubate for 5 min at 65°C followed by incubating on ice for at least 2 min.
- 6. Upon completion, proceed immediately with "Protocol: Reverse transcription".

Protocol: Reverse transcription

Important points before starting

- The 6 µl product from "Protocol: RT primer hybridization", page 22, is the starting material for this protocol.
- Set up reactions on ice.
- Do not vortex any reagents or reactions.

Procedure: Reverse Transcription

- 7. Prepare the reagents required for Reverse Transcription.
 - 7a. Thaw BC3 Buffer, 5x, if required at room temperature.
 - 7b. Mix by flicking the tube, and centrifuge briefly.

Note: The RNase Inhibitor and EZ Reverse Transcriptase should be removed from the freezer just before use and placed on ice. After use, immediately return the enzymes to the freezer.

8. On ice, prepare the reverse transcription reactions as described in Table 4. Briefly centrifuge, mix by pipetting up and down 7 to 8 times (do not vortex), and briefly centrifuge again.

* When working with RNA amounts ≤20 ng, dilute 1 μl of the EZ Reverse Transcriptase to 5 μl using 4 μl of Nucleasefree Water. Pipet up and down 7 to 8 times to mix. Then, add 1 μl to the reaction.

9. Incubate the tube in a thermal cycler with a heated lid (103°C) according to Table 5.

10. Upon completion, proceed with "Protocol: Second-strand synthesis". Alternatively, the samples can be stored at -30 to -15°C in a constant temperature freezer.

Protocol: Second-strand synthesis

Important points before starting

- The 10 µl product from "Protocol: Reverse transcription", page 23, is the starting material for this protocol.
- Set up reactions on ice.
- Do not vortex any reagents or reactions.

Procedure: Second-strand synthesis

11. Prepare the reagents required for second-strand synthesis.

11a. Thaw XC Buffer and dNTP at room temperature.

11b. Mix by flicking the tube, and then centrifuge briefly.

Note: RH RNase and BX Enzyme should both be removed from the freezer just before use and placed on ice. After use, immediately return the enzymes to the freezer.

15. Prepare the reagents required for end-repair and A-addition.

15a. Thaw ERA Buffer, 10x, at room temperature.

15b. Mix by flicking the tube, and then centrifuge briefly.

Note: The ERA Enzyme should be removed from the freezer just before use and placed on ice. After use, immediately return the enzymes to the freezer.

16. On ice, prepare the end-repair and A-addition reactions as described in Table 8. Briefly centrifuge, mix by pipetting up and down 7 to 8 times (do not vortex), and briefly centrifuge again.

- Set up reactions on ice.
- Do not vortex any reagents or reactions.

QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set Adapter Plate

- Important: The QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set Adapter Plate (UDIN-96#A): A or B used in the adapter ligation reaction must be paired with the matching QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set (UDIS-96#K) Primer Plate: A or B used in the Universal PCR amplification reaction.
 - The QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index (UDIN-96#A) adapters are sealed in a 96-well plate with pierceable aluminum heat-sealing film.
 - The pierceable aluminum seal does not need to be removed; instead, puncture the film using standard 200 µl pipette tips to withdraw the appropriate adapter and adapter volume.
 - Important: Thaw the adapter plate on ice or store at 4°C before usage. After it is fully thawed, spin down the plate at 1000 g for 1 min.

QIAseq 12-Index I Adapters

- Important: The QIAseq 12-Index I Adapters (IL-N7##) are in individual tubes
- **Important**: Thaw the tubes on ice or store at 4°C before usage. After the tubes are fully thawed, spin down the tubes.

QIAseq 96-Index I Set Adapter Plate

- Important: The QIAseq 96-Index I Set Adapter Plate (IL-7##NJ): A, B, C, or D used in the adapter ligation reaction must be paired with the matching QIAseq 96-Index I (IL-5##SK) Primer Plate: A, B, C, or D used in the Universal PCR amplification reaction.
 - The QIAseq 96-Index I Set (IL-7##NJ) adapters are sealed in a 96-well plate that needs to have the seal removed.
- **Important**: Thaw the adapter plate on ice or store at 4°C before usage. After it is fully thawed, spin down the plate at 1000 g for 1 min. Carefully withdraw the appropriate adapter and adapter volume.

Procedure: Adapter Ligation

- 22. Prepare the reagents required for the Adapter Ligation.
 - 22a. Thaw DNA Ligation Adapter; Ligation Buffer, 5x; and Ligation Solution at room temperature.
 - 22b. Mix by flicking the tube, and then centrifuge briefly.

Note: DNA Ligase should be removed from the freezer just before use and placed on ice. After use, immediately return the enzyme to the freezer.

23. On ice, prepare the adapter ligation reactions as described in Table 10. Briefly centrifuge, mix by pipetting up and down at least 10 to 12 times (do not vortex) after adding all reagents, and briefly centrifuge again.

Important: Only one single-indexed adapter should be used per ligation reaction. Each sample will have a different IL-N7## adapter. Open one adapter tube at a time if using 12-index adapters and avoid cross-contamination. The QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index set adapter layout is described in Figure 3, use a multichannel pipette to pierce the foil prior to using a multichannel pipette to pipet the appropriate amount of adapters.

For QIAseq 96-index I adapters (CDIs) supplied in a plate (layout described in Figure 6), use a multichannel pipette to pipet the appropriate amount of adapters.

Important: Pipet slowly to mix. The reaction mix is very viscous. Do not vortex.

Note: If setting up more than one reaction, prepare a volume of master mix 20% greater than what is required for the total number of reactions.

26. Upon completion, place the reactions on ice and proceed with "Protocol: Cleanup of Adapter-Ligated DNA". Alternatively, the samples can be stored at −30 to −15°C in a constant temperature freezer for up to 3 days.

Protocol: Cleanup of adapter-ligated DNA

Important points before starting

- The entire 100 µl adapter ligated DNA from "Procedure: Adapter Ligation" is the starting material for the cleanup of adapter-ligated DNA.
- Equilibrate the QIAseq Beads to room temperature (15–25°C) for 20–30 min before use.
- Vortex the QIAseq Beads thoroughly to ensure they are well resuspended; the solution should be a homogenous brown color. If a delay in the protocol occurs, simply vortex the beads.
- Important: Prepare fresh 80% ethanol daily.

Procedure: Cleanup of adapter-ligated DNA

- 27. Transfer the 100 μl adapter ligation product into a 1.5 ml DNA LoBind tube or a 300 μl 96-well PCR plate.
- 28. Add 80 µl QlAseq beads. Mix well by pipetting up and down 10 times or vortexing.
- 29. Incubate for 5 min at room temperature.
- 30. Place the tubes/plate on a magnetic rack for 10 min (for 1.5 ml LoBind tubes) or ~15 min (for 300 µl plates) to separate the beads from the supernatant. Once the solution has cleared, with the beads still on the magnetic stand, carefully remove and discard the supernatant.

Important: Do not discard the beads as they contain the DNA of interest.

- 31. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, completely remove residual supernatant.
- 32. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, add 200 μl 80% ethanol. Carefully remove and discard the wash.
- 33. Repeat the ethanol wash.

Important: Completely remove all traces of the ethanol wash after this second wash. Briefly centrifuge and return the tubes or plate to the magnetic stand. Remove the ethanol with a 200 µl pipette first, and then use a 10 µl pipette to remove any residual ethanol.

34. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, air-dry at room temperature for 10 min.

Note: Visually inspect that the pellet is completely dry, and that all residual ethanol is evaporated.

- 35. Remove the tube from the magnetic stand, and elute the DNA from the beads by adding 52 µl Nuclease-free Water. Mix well by pipetting.
- 36. Return the tubes/plate to the magnetic rack until the solution has cleared.
- 37. Transfer 50 µl supernatant to clean tubes/plate.
- Add 35 µl QlAseq Beads to the 50 µl supernatant. Mix well by pipetting up and down 10 times or vortexing.
- 39. Incubate for 5 min at room temperature.

40. Place the tubes/plate on a magnetic rack for 5 min (for tubes) or 10 min (for plates) to separate the beads from the supernatant. Once the solution has cleared, with the beads still on the magnetic stand, carefully remove and discard the supernatant.

Important: Do not discard the beads as they contain the DNA of interest.

- 41. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, add 200 μl 80% ethanol. Carefully remove and discard the wash.
- 42. Repeat the ethanol wash.

Important: Completely remove all traces of the ethanol wash after this second wash. Briefly centrifuge and return the tubes or plate to the magnetic stand. Remove the ethanol with a 200 µl pipette first, and then use a 10 µl pipette to remove any residual ethanol.

43. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, air-dry at room temperature for 10 min.

Note: Visually inspect that the pellet is completely dry, and that all residual ethanol is evaporated. Ethanol carryover to the target enrichment PCR step will affect PCR efficiency.

- Remove the beads from the magnetic stand, and elute cDNA from beads by adding 12.4 µl Nuclease-free Water. Mix well by pipetting.
- 45. Return the tubes/plate to the magnetic rack until the solution has cleared.
- 46. Transfer 10.4 µl of the supernatant to clean PCR tubes or plate.
- 47. Proceed with "Protocol: Target enrichment". Alternatively, the samples can be stored at -30 to -15°C in a constant-temperature freezer for up to 3 days.

Protocol: Target enrichment

Important points before starting

- The entire 10.4 µl product from "Protocol: Cleanup of adapter-ligated DNA", page 33, is the starting material for this protocol.
- Set up reactions on ice.
- Do not vortex any reagents or reactions.

Procedure: Target enrichment

- 48. Prepare the reagents required for the target enrichment.
 - 48a. Thaw QIAseq RNA Buffer, 5x; QIAseq TCR Panel; and IL-Forward Primer at room temperature.
 - 48b. Mix by flicking the tube, and then centrifuge briefly.

Note: HotStarTaq DNA Polymerase should be removed from the freezer just before use and placed on ice. After use, immediately return the enzyme to the freezer.

49. Prepare the target enrichment reactions as described in Table 12, on ice. Briefly centrifuge, mix gently by pipetting up and down 7 to 8 times, and briefly centrifuge again.

Important points before starting

- The entire 20 µl Target Enriched DNA reaction from the "Procedure: Target Enrichment" is the starting material for the cleanup of target enrichment.
- Equilibrate the QIAseq Beads to room temperature (15–25°C) for 20–30 min before use.
- Vortex the QIAseq Beads thoroughly to ensure they are well resuspended; the solution should be a homogenous brown color. If a delay in the protocol occurs, simply vortex the beads.
- Important: Prepare fresh 80% ethanol daily.

Procedure: Cleanup of target enrichment

53. Transfer the completed target enrichment reaction into a 1.5 ml DNA LoBind tube or a 96well PCR plate.

- 54. Add 80 µl Nuclease-free Water to bring each sample to 100 µl.
- 55. Add 70 µl QlAseq beads. Mix well by pipetting up and down at 10 times or vortexing.

Important points before starting

 The 13.4 µl product from "Protocol: Cleanup of target enrichment", page 36, is the starting material for this protocol.

- Set up reactions on ice.
- Do not vortex any reagents or reactions.
- Important: The QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set (UDIS-96#K) Index Primer Plate must be paired with the matching QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set (UDIN-96#A) Adapter Plate: A or B used in the Adapter Ligation reaction.
 - The UDIS-96#K Index Primer Plate A or B contains pre-dispensed, dried index primers and the Universal PCR primer in a 96-well plate.
 - Use standard 200 μl pipet tips to add components directly in the UDIS-96#K Index Primer plates for the universal PCR reaction. See Figure 5 for the layout of the index primers in the plate.
- Important: The QIAseq 12-Index I Adapter (IL-S502) is in an individual tube and must be paired with the IL-N7## tubes.
 - Important: Thaw the tubes on ice or store at 4°C before usage. After the tubes are fully thawed spin down the tubes.
- Important: The QIAseq 96-Index I Set A, B, C, or D (IL-5##SK) Plate must be paired with the matching QIAseq 96-Index I Set (IL-7##NJ) Adapter Plate: A, B, C, or D used in the Adapter Ligation reaction.

* Cycle numbers can be adjusted based on sample type and user experience. Library yield is related to input amount and sample type. For normal PBMC RNA, it is recommended to use 30 cycles for 10–50 ng, 29 cycles for 50–100 ng, 27 cycles for 100–500 ng and 25 cycles for 500–1000 ng.

69. After the reaction is complete, place the reactions on ice and proceed with "Protocol: Cleanup of Universal PCR". Alternatively, the samples can be stored at −30 to −15°C in a constant-temperature freezer for up to 3 days.

Protocol: Cleanup of Universal PCR

Important points before starting

- The entire 20 µl Universal PCR reaction from the "Procedure: Universal PCR" is the starting material for the cleanup of Universal PCR.
- Equilibrate the QIAseq Beads to room temperature (15–25°C) for 20–30 min before use.
- Vortex the QlAseq Beads thoroughly to ensure they are well resuspended; the solution should be a homogenous brown color. If a delay in the protocol occurs, simply vortex the beads.
- Important: Prepare fresh 80% ethanol daily.

Procedure: Cleanup of Universal PCR

- Transfer the completed Universal PCR reaction into a 1.5 ml DNA LoBind tube or a 96-well PCR plate.
- 71. Add 80 µl Nuclease-free Water to bring each sample to 100 µl.
- 72. Add 70 µl QIAseq beads. Mix well by pipetting up and down at 10 times or vortexing.
- 73. Incubate for 5 min at room temperature.
- 74. Place the tubes/plate on a magnetic rack for 5 min (for tubes) or 10 min (for plates) to separate the beads from the supernatant. Once the solution has cleared, with the beads still on the magnetic stand, carefully remove and discard the supernatant.

Important: Do not discard the beads as they contain the DNA of interest.

- 75. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, add 200 μl 80% ethanol. Carefully remove and discard the wash.
- 76. Repeat the ethanol wash.

Important: Completely remove all traces of the ethanol wash after this second wash. Briefly centrifuge and return the tubes or plate to the magnetic stand. Remove the ethanol with a 200 μ l pipette first, and then use a 10 μ l pipette to remove any residual ethanol.

77. With the beads still on the magnetic stand, air-dry at room temperature for 10 min.

Note: Visually inspect that the pellet is completely dry, and that all residual ethanol is evaporated, but be careful not to overdry the beads as this will significantly decrease elution efficiency.

- Remove the beads from the magnetic stand, and elute the DNA from the beads by adding 30 µl Nuclease-free Water. Mix well by pipetting.
- 79. Return the tubes/plate to the magnetic rack until the solution has cleared.
- 80. Transfer 28 µl supernatant to clean PCR tubes or plate.

81. Proceed with "Appendix A: Library Quantification Using the QIAseq Library Quant System", page 54. Alternatively, the library can be stored in a -30 to -15°C in a constanttemperature freezer for up to 3 months prior to quantification using the QIAseq Library Quant System. Once quantification is performed, proceed with the "Protocol: Sequencing Setup on Illumina MiSeq and NextSeq", next page.

Note: The Agilent Bioanalyzer can be used to check the fragment size and concentration with the High Sensitivity DNA Kit. For details, please refer to Appendix C: Library .

Protocol: Sequencing Setup on Illumina MiSeq and NextSeq

Important notes before starting:

- Accurate library quantification is essential for accurate flow cell clustering and instrument loading. Libraries quantitated by qPCR is the most accurate. We highly recommend to use the QIAseq Library Quant System (cat. no. 333304 or 333314).
- Due to the library size, the extension time should be 4 min at 72°C instead of 2 min indicated in the QIAseq Library Quant System protocol.
- Recommendations for library dilution concentrations and library loading concentrations are based on the QIAseq Library Quant System (see Appendix A: Library Quantification Using the QIAseq Library Quant System, page 54).
- QIAseq A Read1 Primer I (Custom Read 1 Sequencing Primer) MUST be used when performing sequencing on Illumina platforms.
- QIAseq A Read1 Primer I (the Custom Read 1 Sequencing Primer) goes into the following specific reagent cartridge positions:
 - MiniSeq Position #15
 - MiSeq Position #18
 - NextSeq Position #7
- Download Illumina compatible sample sheets for different sequencing instruments at www.qiagen.com, from the "Resources" tab of the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries.
- Paired-end sequencing is required for the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries on Illumina platforms.

- When using 10 bp Indexing kits such as the QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set A (cat. no. 333725) or QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set B (cat. no. 333735)
 - Index 1 and Index 2 are 10 bp cycles each
 - 249 bp paired-end sequencing is recommended for complete variable regions sequencing
 - 259/39 bp asymmetric paired-end sequencing is recommended for CDR3 region sequencing
- When using 8 bp index kits such as QIAseq 12-Index I (cat. no. 333714) or QIAseq 96-Index I Set A, B, C, or D (cat. nos. 333727, 333737, 333747, 333757)
 - Index 1 and Index 2 are 8 bp cycles each
 - 251 bp paired-end sequencing is recommended for complete variable region sequencing.
 - 261/41 bp asymmetrical paired-end sequencing is recommended for CDR3 region sequencing
- For complete instructions on how to denature sequencing libraries, prepare custom read 1 sequencing primers, and set up a sequencing run, please refer to the system-specific Illumina documentation.
- Instrument-specific imagery is included to aid in sequencing preparations.

Sequencing preparations for MiSeq when using 8 base CDI indexes: QIAseq 12-Index I (cat. no. 333714) or QIAseq 96-Index I Set A, B, C, or D (cat. nos. 333727, 333737, 333747, 333757)

- 1. **Sample sheet setup**: Set up the sample sheet with Custom Sequencing Read 1 primer using Illumina Experiment Manager v1.2, or later (Figure 7).
- 2. The 8 bp sample CDI indices of QIAseq Immune Repertoire libraries are compatible with Illumina Nextera XT v2 adapter sample index system. Select and check the parameters as follows:

Select Application: Check FASTQ Only

Sample Prep Kit: Select Nextera XT v2

Index Reads: Select 2

Read Type: Select Paired-End Read

For complete variable region:

Cycles for Read 1 and 2: Select 251

For CDR3 region sequencing only

Cycles for Read 2: Select 41

Important: Check Custom Primer for Read 1

3. **Sample dilution and pooling**: Dilute libraries to 2 or 4 nM for MiSeq. Then, combine libraries with different sample indexes in equimolar amounts if similar sequencing depth is needed for each library.

Note: Recommendations for library dilution concentrations are based on QIAseq Library Quant System.

 Library preparation and loading: Prepare and load the library onto a MiSeq according to the MiSeq System Denature and Dilute Libraries Guide. The final library concentration is 10–12 pM on the MiSeq.

Note: Recommendations for library loading concentrations are based on QIAseq Library Quant System.




Figure 8. MiSeq Reagent Cartridge. A: Position 18 for Read 1 Custom Primer. B and C are not relevant.

5. Custom Sequencing Primer for Read 1 preparation and loading: Use 597 µl HT1 (Hybridization Buffer) to dilute 3 µl QIAseq A Read 1 Custom Primer I (provided) to obtain a final concentration of 0.5 µM. Load 600 µl of the diluted QIAseq A Read 1 Primer I to position 18 of the MiSeq reagent cartridge (Figure 8). For more details, please refer to the Illumina protocol: miseq_using_custom_primers_15041638_b.pdf for the MiSeq.

6. Upon completion of the sequencing run, proceed to "Appendix B: Data Analysis Using QIAGEN's QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit Data Analysis Portal".

Sequencing preparations for MiSeq with 10 base UDI Sample Indexes: QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set A (cat. no. 333725) or QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set B (cat. no. 333735)

7. When working with the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Panel custom QIAseq 96-UDIs, use Local Run Manager (LRM) v2 on the instrument to upload a sample sheet (see the "Resource" tab of the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Panel and download the

appropriate template) and proceed with sequencing: Read 1 is 249 bp, Read 2 is 249 bp, and each Index Read is 10 bp.

 Follow steps 3–5 in "Sequencing preparations for MiSeq when using 8 base CDI indexes: QIAseq 12-Index I (cat. no. 333714) or QIAseq 96-Index I Set A, B, C, or D (cat. nos. 333727, 333737, 333747, 333757)".

Sequencing preparations for NextSeq when using 8 base CDI indexes: QIAseq 12-Index I (cat. no. 333714) or QIAseq 96-Index I Set A, B, C, or D (cat. nos. 333727, 333737, 333747, 333757)

- 9. **Read setup**: Use asymmetrical paired-end reads (261 cycles for read 1 and 41 cycles for read 2) with NextSeq 300 cycles kit and it is mainly for CDR3 region sequencing.
- 10. Indexing setup: Use dual indexes (8 bp cycles of each).
- 11. **Sample dilution and pooling**: Dilute libraries to 0.5, 1, 2, or 4 nM for NextSeq. Then, combine libraries with different sample indexes in equimolar amounts if similar sequencing depth is needed for each library.

Note: Recommendations for library dilution concentrations are based on the QIAseq Library Quant System.

 Library preparation and loading: Prepare and load the library onto a NextSeq according to the NextSeq System Denature and Dilute Libraries Guide. The final library concentration is 1.0–1.2 pM on the NextSeq.

Note: Recommendations for library loading concentrations are based on the QIAseq Library Quant System.




Figure 9. NextSeq reagent cartridge.

 Custom Sequencing Primer for Read 1 preparation and loading: Use 1994 µl HT1 (Hybridization Buffer) to dilute 6 µl QlAseq A Read 1 Primer I (provided) to obtain a final concentration of 0.3 µM. Load 2 ml of the diluted QlAseq A Read 1 Primer I to position 7 of the NextSeq reagent cartridge (Figure 9).

Note: All other steps, refer to run setup workflow as described in the NextSeq 500 System Guide (part #15046563) or NextSeq 550 System Guide (part #15069765-02).

Sequencing preparations for NextSeq with 10 base UDI Sample Indexes: QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set A (cat. no. 333725) or QIAseq 96-Unique Dual Index Set B (cat. no. 333735)

- 15. When working with the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries custom QIAseq 96-UDIs, use Local Run Manager (LRM) v2 on the instrument to upload a sample sheet (see the "Resource" tab of the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Panel and download the appropriate template) and proceed with sequencing: Read 1 is 259 bp, Read 2 is 39 bp, and each Index Read is 10 bp.
- Follow steps 11–13 in "Sequencing preparations for NextSeq when using 8 base CDI indexes: QIAseq 12-Index I (cat. no. 333714) or QIAseq 96-Index I Set A, B, C, or D (cat. nos. 333727, 333737, 333747, 333757)".

a)	Suboptimal reaction conditions due to low RNA quality	Make sure to use high-quality RNA to ensure optimal activity of the library enzymes.					
b)	Inefficient PCR	QIAseq Beads need to be completely dried before elution. Ethanol carryover to target enrichment and universal PCR will affect reaction efficiency.					
c)	Insufficient universal PCR cycles	Increase universal PCR cycle numbers to achieve sufficient library amount for sequencing.

a)	Larger library fragments after universal PCR	After the universal PCR, library fragments are larger than the intended peak and can be a PCR artifact due to over-amplification of the library. Over- amplification of the library won't affect the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit sequencing performance. Decreasing the universal PCR cycle numbers can reduce over-amplification.					
b)	Small fragments in final library	Make sure the correct bead amount is used. PCR tube or plate must be sealed well to prevent evaporation during PCR reaction.

a)	Too low or too high cluster density	Accurate library quantification is the key for optimal cluster density on any sequencing instrument. The QIAseq Library Quant System method, which involves PCR-based quantification, is recommended. a)	Known clonotype not detected	Clonotype and immune repertoire diversity detection sensitivity is directly related to the input RNA and read depth. See Table 2 for suggested sequencing capacity needed.

Appendix A: Library Quantification Using the QIAseq Library Quant System

The library yield measurements from the Bioanalyzer or TapeStation rely on fluorescence dyes that intercalate into DNA. These dyes cannot discriminate between molecules with or without adapter sequences, yet only complete QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA libraries with full adapter sequences will be sequenced. Due to the superior sensitivity of qPCR, we recommend quantifying the libraries using QIAGEN's QIAseq Library Quant Array Kit (cat. no. 333304) or QIAseq Library Quant Assay Kit (cat. no. 333314), which contains laboratory-verified forward and reverse primers, together with a DNA standard. With this system, the correct dilution of the library can be determined for sequencing. Please refer to the relevant handbook(s) (available at **www.qiagen.com**) for library quantification.

Important: The extension time should be 4 minutes at 72°C instead of the 2 minutes indicated in the standard protocol of the QIAseq Library Quant System.

Appendix B: Data Analysis Using QIAGEN's QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit Data Analysis Portal

After sequencing, the results can be analyzed using QIAGEN's QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit data analysis portal. Our data analysis software will perform mapping to the reference sequence, UMI counting, read trimming (removing primer sequences) as well as immune repertoire diversity assessment and clonotype classification. For the analysis, use Google Chrome[™] or Mozilla[®] Firefox[®], as the portal is not compatible with Internet Explorer[™] (IE). Log in or create a QIAGEN account at **www.qiagen.com**. From there, log in to the GeneGlobe Data Analysis Center at: **www.qiagen.com/shop/genes-and-pathways/dataanalysis-center-overview-page/**.

Appendix C: Library QC

NGS Library QC




Figure 10. Bioanalyzer image of QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit library for Illumina instruments. A library was prepared using the QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kit and assessed using an Agilent 2100 Bioanalyzer. The size of the majority of the library fragments are between 600–2000 bp.

After the library is constructed and purified, QC can be performed with the QIAxcel, or Agilent's Bioanalyzer or TapeStation can be used to check for the correct fragment size distribution of library fragments and for the absence of adapters or adapter-dimers (~<200 bp) and concentration with the High Sensitivity DNA Kit. Libraries prepared with QIAseq Immune Repertoire RNA Library Kits demonstrate a size distribution between 600–2000 bp (Figure 10). Amounts of DNA under the appropriate peaks can be used to quantify the libraries. However, due to the superior sensitivity of qPCR, we recommend quantifying the libraries using the QIAseq Library Quant System (see "Appendix A: Library Quantification Using the QIAseq Library Quant System", page 54).
