Source: Goat

General description: Goat polyclonal antibody to human IgG. IgG is a monomeric immunoglobulin, with two heavy chains and two light chains. IgG can be found in blood and is the most abundant immunoglobulin, constituting 75% of serum immunoglobulins in humans. There are 4 subclasses (IgG1 (66%), IgG2 (23%), IgG3 (7%) and IgG4 (4%)) that can bind to many types of pathogens, protecting the body against them by complement activation, opsonization for phagocytosis and neutralisation of their toxins.

Alternative names: Immunoglobulin G antibody.

Form: Polyclonal antibody supplied as a 500 µl (2 mg/ml) aliquot in PBS, 20% glycerol and 0.05% sodium azide. This antibody is epitope-affinity purified from goat antiserum.

Immunogen: Full human IgG affinity purified from serum of four normal donors tested and found negative for Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, HIV I and II antibodies using protein G. Purity >95% by SDS-PAGE.

Specificity: Using serum samples detects the light and heavy chains by Western blot.

Reactivity: Reacts with Human proteins
